MAKING GOD REAL *In the Orthodox Christian Home*

MAKE LENT A SPIRITUAL SPRING

Confession

Lent from the earliest days of Christianity was always a period of public penance—a period of self-examination, a period of clearing away the underbrush of sin to let the Sun (Son) of God's love shine on us.

Many times we become so accustomed to our way of living that we feel it is the only way to live. The doctor in *Les Miserables* spent years in the Bastille mending shoes in the darkness of his cell. When at last the Bastille fell and he was freed he found himself afraid. He was afraid to go out. So the rest of his life was spent in a darkened cell, mending shoes with the door un-locked.

This story brings to mind what St. John Chrysostom said once, "The sun may be shining in all its brightness but each one of us is free to shut it out of our lives merely by closing our eyelids." Unfortunately people can shut the sun out of their lives and become accustomed to the darkness in which they live. Like the cobbler in *Les Miserables*, they become prisoners but by their own choice. For the Sun of God's love is always shining and to let it into our lives is as simple as opening one's eyelids.

During Lent we are urged to come to ourselves, leave the darkness of sin and return to the Father. It is for this reason that the Church offers us the Sacrament of Confession. Orthodox parents should discuss this sacrament with their children and prepare to come to it with them. A very helpful booklet to prepare both parents and children for confession is Fr. Hopko's *If We Confess Our Sins*.

The Special Services of Lent

An excellent way to help our children enter into the real meaning of Lent is by attending the many special Lenten services. Foremost among these are:

a. *The Liturgy of the Pre-Sanctified Gifts*. This ancient liturgy is a living testimony from the early Church testifying to the fact that the Christian cannot live the life of Christ unless he continually renews his union with the Source of Life, Christ, by receiving His precious Body and Blood. During the early Church, the divine liturgy was not celebrated Monday through Friday during Lent because it was joyfully paschal in character and thus, not in keeping with the somber and penitential season of Lent. St. Basil tells us that the Christians of this period had to receive Communion four times a week, i.e., Wednesday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday. In order not to deprive themselves of the Sacrament on the Wednesdays and Fridays of Lent, the Liturgy of the Pre-Sanctified Gifts was composed. It is a vesper service to which prayers from the later part of the liturgy are added. The bread and wine are consecrated at the previous Sunday's liturgy and are merely distributed at this liturgy, i.e., there is no consecration of the gifts. The Pre-Sanctified Liturgy is penitential in character. The atmosphere of the sanctuary is somber. Wearing dark vestments the priest offers prayers that are full of humility and penitence. It is one of the most mystical of all services—a service that all Orthodox families should attend together during Lent. (For the text and explanation of this liturgy, use the booklet "The Pre-Sanctified Liturgy" by the Orthodox Church in America or one recommended by your parish priest).

b. *The Akathist Hymn* is chanted on the first five Friday evenings of Lent in Greek Orthodox Churches. It is a beautiful poem enlarging upon the meaning of the angel's greeting to Mary at the Annunciation, "Hail, thou that are highly favoured" (Luke 1:28). A beautiful conversation takes place between the Virgin and the Angel on the meaning of the Incarnation. The story of the birth of Jesus is beautifully retold. The Akathist Hymn is chanted during Lent in view of the fact that the great feast of the Annunciation, which it describes, is usually observed during the Lenten period. The Akathist is the kontakion (a hymn highlighting the main theme of a feast day) of the Annunciation.

Orthodox families should attend this service with an Akathist prayer book to follow the meaning of the beautiful verses. Most churches provide such books before the service.

THE EPISTLE

(For Sunday of Forgiveness)

Sing praises to our God, sing praises. Sing praises to our King, sing praises. O clap your hands, all ye nations.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Romans. (13:11-14:4)

Brethren, salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed; the night is far gone, the day is at hand. Let us then cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves becomingly as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires. As for the man who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not for disputes over opinions. One believes he may eat anything, while the weak man eats only vegetables. Let not him who eats despise him who abstains, and let not him who abstains pass judgment on him who eats; for God has welcomed him. Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? It is before his own master that he stands or falls. And he will be upheld, for the Master is able to make him stand.

THE GOSPEL

(For Sunday of Forgiveness)

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. (6:14-21)

The Lord said to His Disciples: If you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father also will forgive you; but if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. And when you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by men. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by men but by your Father Who is in secret; and your Father Who sees in secret will reward you. Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

Commemorations

Orthodox Christians
 Faithful Orthodox fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when they receive Holy Communion in fulfillment of Christ's command to eat His Body and drink His Blood. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, communicants should not be conscious of grave sin, have fasted from the night before taking communion, and seek to live in charity and love with their neighbors. Persons conscious of grave sin must first be reconciled with God and the Church through the Sacrament of Penance (Confession and Absolution). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

Non-Orthodox
 We welcome to this celebration of the Eucharist those Christians who are not fully united with us. It is a consequence of the sad divisions in Christianity that we cannot extend to them a general invitation to receive Communion. Orthodox believe that the Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray.

Not Receiving Communion
 Those not receiving sacramental communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another by receiving a piece of blessed bread following the dismissal prayers.

Welcome to Ss. Peter and Paul
 To encourage our worship in a proper spirit of prayer and devotion, we respectfully ask you to enter the sanctuary quietly during the Divine Liturgy.
