How to Read the Bible at Home

“If I had to form a man from childhood as I thought best, I should like to have him choose a few good passages of Scripture and to make him read them often until he knew them by *heart*.” - Bossuet.

During World War II a South Sea islander showed an American GI his copy of the Bible and said, “This is my most prized possession.”

With a hint of disdain, the soldier replied, “We’ve outgrown all that sort of thing, you know.”

“It’s a good thing we haven’t,” the islander shot back. “If it wasn’t for this Bible, you would have been a meal as soon as we laid eyes on you.”

One of the tragedies of many people today is the feeling that they have outgrown the need for God’s word. The disaster they bring upon themselves as a result is tragic. But the person who reads the Bible believing that God is actually speaking to him through what he reads-this person’s life is transformed. He finds healing, wholeness, power, peace, forgiveness, love and purpose.

A Few Case Histories

Let us examine a few case histories of how this has actually happened in the lives of people.

Most of us remember how Paul’s life changed completely after he heard the word of God on the road to Damascus. Some of us recall that the conversion of Augustine the great sinner to Augustine the great saint and bishop happened when he picked up the Bible one day and read a passage that spoke to his soul. But these are old examples. They happened long ago. They do not seem as real as what happens today. So let us take a look at how the Bible has helped people in our day.

Example No. 1. Some years ago we had a famous biochemist from the University of Minnesota, Dr. Fred Smith, address one of our District G.O.Y.A. Conferences in Minneapolis. He delivered one of the most inspiring talks I have ever heard. All of us who were present felt the presence of God that evening. What I did not know at that time was that Dr. Smith had previously been an agnostic. He had rejected the Christianity of his youth. What brought him back to Christ was a Bible verse he heard one day that he simply could not get out of his mind. It was this Bible verse that brought him back to Christ-this time as a truly committed Christian. He became one of the most convincing supporters of Christianity on the University campus. Until his death a few years ago he held a weekly Bible class in his home. From agnostic to Christian because of a Bible verse!

THE EPISTLE

(For the Third Sunday of Great Lent)

O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance.

To Thee, O Lord, have I cried, O my God.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Hebrews. (4:14-5:6)

Brethren, since we have a High Priest, Who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but One Who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness. Because of this he is bound to offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not take the honor upon himself, but he is called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not exalt Himself to be made a high priest, but was appointed by Him Who said to Him, "Thou art My Son, today I have begotten Thee"; as He says also in another place, "Thou art a priest forever, after the order of Melchizedek."

THE GOSPEL

(For the Third Sunday of Great Lent)

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark. (8:34-9:1)

The Lord said, "If any man would come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for My sake and the Gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? For what can a man give in return for his soul? For whoever is ashamed of Me and My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels." And Jesus said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the Kingdom of God come with power."

Commemorations

Orthodox Christians

Faithful Orthodox fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when they receive Holy Communion in fulfillment of Christ's command to eat His Body and drink His Blood. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, communicants should not be conscious of grave sin, have fasted from the night before taking communion, and seek to live in charity and love with their neighbors. Persons conscious of grave sin must first be reconciled with God and the Church through the Sacrament of Penance (Confession and Absolution). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

Non-Orthodox

We welcome to this celebration of the Eucharist those Christians who are not fully united with us. It is a consequence of the sad divisions in Christianity that we cannot extend to them a general invitation to receive Communion. Orthodox believe that the Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray.

Not Receiving Communion

Those not receiving sacramental communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another by receiving a piece of blessed bread following the dismissal prayers.

To encourage our worship in a proper spirit of prayer and devotion, we respectfully ask you to enter the sanctuary quietly during the Divine Liturgy.

- the Hymn to the Theotokos "It is Truly Meet"

Please follow the directions of the ushers during Communion and dismissal; refrain from using cell phones in the narthex; and be considerate of those praying and converse in the hall, outside or downstairs.
