Words of Eternal Life

Words have power. God created the world out of nothing by His words. We who are created in the image of God also create our worlds through our words. We live in the world we create for ourselves and what kind of world this is depends on the words we use to create it. With our words we can spread forgiveness and love, reconciliation and healing, warmth and light, encouragement, knowledge and power — or the opposite. Words create an attitude as much as they come from an attitude. One kind word of encouragement can resurrect a soul and give a person the will and strength to do what he could not have done otherwise. "A wholesome tongue is a tree of life" (Prov 15:4). We shape our eternal destiny by what comes out of our mouths. "For by your words you shall be justified, and by your words you shall be condemned" (Mt 12:37).

If such power and inner spiritual force are to be found in human words, how much more are they to be found in God's words? God's words are *Spirit and life* (Jn 6:63), they are ever-lasting and permanent (Mt 24:35, Mk 13:31, Lk 21:33). Where are God's words to be found? The answer: in the Holy Scriptures.

The Fathers knew that the Scriptures have a living power (Lk 4:32; 1 Cor 2:4), "alive and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit... a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart" (Heb 4:12). This power is transmitted to the soul of the reader. Reading the words of God gives us peace (Ps 119:165; Jn 16:33; Rom 15:4), joy (Jn 15:11; 1 Jn 16:33), cleanses us from sin (Jn 15:3) and gives us the power to overcome sin (Ps 119:11), teaches us the Faith, preparing us to witness our faith (2 Tim 3:17; Eph 6:17; Heb 4:12), and gives us strength for all of our works, even the worldly (Josh 1:8; James 1:25; Ps 18:29). St. Basil the Great referred to the Holy Scriptures as a "pharmacy open to all souls, such that each of us might be able to find the medicine suited to our own particular illness." The Bible records both God's words to us and man's response to these words, both good and bad. From the former, the Bible is an ever-flowing source of power, essential to our spiritual growth and salvation. From the latter, it is a timeless guide, providing us examples and exhortations from other people's lives with which to judge and direct our own lives. From both of these elements, reading Scripture has a direct impact on the way we live and experience life.

For this reason, it was a common practice among Christians to memorize the Scriptures, such that "they may be always an open book to the soul" available to provide guidance for every circumstance of life. "The mind should swim, as it were, in the words of God," said St. Seraphim of Sarov, who himself read the entire New Testament once a week. St. John Chrysostom considered that "without the daily sweetening of the soul with the words of Holy Scripture, it is impossible to be saved." St. Maximus the Confessor saw the reading of Scripture as a form of Holy Communion: just as the Word of God incarnates Himself in the Eucharist elements, so He incarnates Himself in the human words of the Scriptures. "If a man loves Me, he will *keep my words:* and My Father will love him, and We will come unto him, and *make Our abode* with him" (Jn 14:23). For the Fathers, daily communion with God through the Scriptures went hand in hand with Communion on Sundays; to receive the latter without the former would not have made sense to them.

THE EPISTLE

(For the Unmercenaries)

In the saints that are in His earth hath the Lord been wondrous.

I beheld the Lord ever before me, for He is at my right hand, that I might not be shaken.

The Reading from the First Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians. (12:27-13:8)

Brethren, you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed in the Church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then workers of miracles, then healers, helpers, administrators, speakers in various kinds of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak with tongues? Do all interpret? But earnestly desire the higher gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way. If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have, and if I deliver my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing. Love is patient and kind; love is not jealous or boastful; it is not arrogant or rude. Love does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrong, but rejoices in the right. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends.

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. (8:28-9:1)

Orthodox Christians

Faithful Orthodox fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when they receive Holy Communion in fulfillment of Christ's command to eat His Body and drink His Blood. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, communicants should not be conscious of grave sin, have fasted from the night before taking communion, and seek to live in charity and love with their neighbors. Persons conscious of grave sin must first be reconciled with God and the Church through the Sacrament of Penance (Confession and Absolution). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

Non-Orthodox

We welcome to this celebration of the Eucharist those Christians who are not fully united with us. It is a consequence of the sad divisions in Christianity that we cannot extend to them a general invitation to receive Communion. Orthodox believe that the Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not vet exist, and for which we must all pray.

Not Receiving Communion

Those not receiving sacramental communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another by receiving a piece of blessed bread following the dismissal prayers.

To encourage our worship in a proper spirit of prayer and devotion, we respectfully ask you to enter the sanctuary quietly during the Divine Liturgy.


