

PLACING OF THE SASH OF THE THEOTOKOS IN HALKOPRATEIA AND TWELFTH SUNDAY OF MATTHEW

TODAY WE COMMEMORATE: GENNADIUS, PATRIARCH OF CONSTANTINOPLE; HIEROMARTYR CYPRIAN, BISHOP OF CARTHAGE; JOHN, METROPOLITAN OF KIEV; AIDAN, BISHOP OF LINDISFARNE

RESURRECTIONAL APOLYTIKION (Tone 3)

Let the heavens rejoice and the earth be glad, for the Lord hath done a mighty act with His own arm. He hath trampled down death by death, and became the first-born from the dead. He hath delivered us from the depths of Hades, granting the world the Great Mercy.

APOLYTIKION for placing of the Virgin's sash (Tone 8)

Thou hast bestowed upon thy city, O ever-virgin Theotokos and shelter of mankind, the robe and the belt of thy pure body, as a secure mantle, which by thy seedless birth-giving have remained without corruption; for by thee are nature and time regenerated. Wherefore, we implore thee to grant thy city safety, and our souls the Great Mercy.

TROPARION of Ss. Peter & Paul (Tone 4)

O foremost in the ranks of Apostles, and teachers of the world, Peter and Paul, intercede with the Master of all to grant safety to the world and to our souls the great mercy.

KONTAKION for placing of the Virgin's sash (Tone 4)

O pure Virgin, the Church joyously celebrates the placing of thy divine belt and cries out to thee in supplication: Save us all from powerful enemies, crush the arrogance of unbelievers, and direct our lives to the doing of the divine will of the Lord.

THE EPISTLE

(For the Placing of the Sash of the Theotokos)

My soul doth magnify the Lord, and my spirit doth rejoice in God my Savior. For He hath regarded the lowliness of His servant.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Hebrews. (9:1-7)

Brethren, even the first covenant had regulations for worship and an earthly sanctuary. For a tent was prepared, the outer one, in which were the lamp stand and the table and the bread of the Presence; it is called the Holy Place. Behind the second curtain stood a tent called the Holy of Holies, having the golden altar of incense and the ark of the covenant covered on all sides with gold, which contained a golden urn holding the manna, and Aaron's rod that budded, and the tables of the covenant; above it were the cherubim of glory overshadowing the mercy seat. Of these things we cannot now speak in detail. These preparations having thus been made, the priests go continually into the outer tent, performing their ritual duties; but into the second only the high priest goes, and he but once a year, and not without taking blood which he offers for himself and for the errors of the people.

THE GOSPEL (For the Twelfth Sunday of Matthew)

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. (19:16-26)

At that time, a young man came up to Jesus, kneeling and saying, "Good Teacher, what good deed must I do, to have eternal life?" And He said to him, "Why do you call Me good? No one is good but One, that is, God. If you would enter life, keep the commandments." He said to Him, "Which?" And Jesus said, "You shall not kill, you shall not commit adultery, you shall not steal, you shall not bear false witness, honor your father and mother, and you shall love your neighbor as yourself." The young man said to Him, "All these I have observed; what do I still lack?" Jesus said to him, "If you would be perfect, go, sell what you possess and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." When the young man heard this, he went away sorrowful; for he had great possessions. And Jesus said to his disciples, "Truly, I say to you, it will be hard for a rich man to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Again I tell you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." When the disciples heard this they were greatly astonished, saying, "Who then can be saved?" But Jesus looked at them and said to them, "With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

Orthodox Christians

Faithful Orthodox fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when they receive Holy Communion in fulfillment of Christ's command to eat His Body and drink His Blood. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, communicants should not be conscious of grave sin, have fasted from the night before taking communion, and seek to live in charity and love with their neighbors. Persons conscious of grave sin must first be reconciled with God and the Church through the Sacrament of Penance (Confession and Absolution). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

Non-Orthodox

We welcome to this celebration of the Eucharist those Christians who are not fully united with us. It is a consequence of the sad divisions in Christianity that we cannot extend to them a general invitation to receive Communion. Orthodox believe that the Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith. life, and worship of the community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray.

Not Receiving Communion

Those not receiving sacramental communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another by receiving a piece of blessed bread following the dismissal prayers.

Please follow the directions of the ushers during Communion and dismissal; refrain from using cell phones in the narthex; and be considerate of those praying and converse in the hall, outside or downstairs.

ANGELS

Angels are invisible spirits which are usually represented with wings to indicate the speed with which they carry messages from God to man. Angels are also sometimes depicted as small children to indicate that they are without sin and that they possess eternal youth. The number of angels is probably beyond count but only three of them - Michael, Raphael and Gabriel - are known by name. The Scriptures frequently refer to multitudes of angels and there is a personal guardian angel for everyone. In types there is a wide variation in angels; there are nine classes or choirs of them. Included are Angels, Archangels, Princedoms, Powers, Virtues, Dominations, Thrones, Seraphim and Cherubim. Angels are endowed with knowledge far superior to that of man; they know all things that happen on earth. They are also endowed with great strength as indicated by the angel who slew 185,000 Assyrians in the Scriptures and the ease with which the angel at the Resurrection rolled away the huge stone sealing the sepulcher of Christ. There are also evil angels who, headed by Lucifer,

AN EARTHLY ANGEL AND A HEAVENLY MAN

here is no disputing that ST. JOHN was a great teacher of nations. Far and wide he preached the baptism of repentance for the remission of sins. Because of this, a series of names are associated with him. These are not arbitrary designations, for they are taken from the Sacred Scriptures and hymnology of the Church. Consider these:

ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST — This is his best known name, for he is the one who baptized our Lord in the waters of the Jordan. St. Matthew writes: "Then came Jesus from Galilee to Jordan unto John, to be baptized of him."

ST. JOHN THE FORERUNNER – He came to announce and prepare the people for the Saviour. St. Matthew quotes Malachi: "Behold, I send my messenger before thy face, who shall prepare thy way before thee."

ST. JOHN THE PROPHET – Again St. Matthew: "What went you out to see? A prophet? Yea, I say unto you, and more than a prophet."

ST. JOHN, ANGEL IN THE FLESH – Hymns use this term, proclaiming of him: "Angel, for you have led an incorporeal life . . ."

ST. JOHN THE MARTYR – Again, hymns of the ritual say of John: "Martyr, for you have been beheaded for Christ."

Let us not forget St. John's **HUMILITY** when he proclaims of Christ: "Behold the Lamb of God . . . The latchet of Whose shoes I am not worthy to stoop down and unloosen."
