MAKING GOD REAL
In the Orthodox Christian Home
Discovering Our God-given Talents

It is important that we teach our children that all that we have, i.e., our body, our life, our possessions, our talents, etc., do not belong to us; they are loaned to us by God. He expects us to use them for His glory and for the betterment of each other.

To each one of us God has given at least one talent or special ability which He expects us to develop and use. Read the parable of the talents (Matthew 25:14-30) and discuss it with your family. Some good discussion questions are: What is a talent? How do I know what my talent is? How can I develop it? Here it may be pointed out that each person has at least one talent. Some may have more, others less, but God has not overlooked anyone. Those who develop their talent find that it increases. Those who do not develop it, lose it.

Since children are curious they will want to know what talent or talents God has given them. It can be explained that God will show them slowly, as they grow, what special talent He has given them. He will use parents, teachers and others to help point out to them what they are best suited to do. It is good to teach them to include in their daily prayers a petition to God that He help them discover and develop the special talent He has given them.

There is great danger here with parents who make unreasonable demands on their children, expecting them to achieve five-talent brilliance in life when God has endowed them with one talent. Or the parents who compare one child to the other, forgetting that no two children have the same number of talents or the same kind. The result is that the one-talent child develops the idea that it is not worthwhile to develop the talent that he does have. "Why try? I can never hope to do as well in school as my sister or make the football team like my brother." Thus the talent that the child has is oftentimes lost, and a sense of inferiority is permitted to ruin his life. The greatest of all fairytale writers-Hans Christian Anderson got his start from a publisher who one day saw some of his writings and said, "Not bad. Keep trying. I'll help you." Here lies one of the greatest contributions of the parent to the child: to discover what talent God has given each child and to encourage the child to develop it. A beautiful poem was written about children by Miriam Dale,

*I am a little child/I paint fearlessly/I hammer loudly/I build recklessly/I read imaginatively/I write originally/
I sing rapturously/May men never quell my creativity/Just refine it!*

God has given each one of us some unique talent or capacity which no one else in this world possesses. Each one of us has a certain way of being helpful to others, and an ability to do certain things as no other person can do them. This gives every man, woman, and child the value of uniqueness. The world would be less if we had not been born. We have added something that was not here before we came. That something is from God, and it is precious beyond all price.

Let us help our children realize that they matter greatly to God. He has entrusted them with something He gave to no other person, and the way they use it is just as important to Him as the way the most gifted men and women use the talents they possess. As Edwin Markham said, "There is waiting a work where only your hands can avail: And so, if you falter, a chord in the music will fail."

Sometimes we look at a great person and we say, "Isn't he a gifted individual?" Yet are we not all gifted? Even the one talent is not ours but a gift from God. These gifts are God's investment in our life. The point of the parable is that God expects a return on His investment. One day He will ask us to account for what we did with the gifts He entrusted to US.

"You have small talents," someone said to a Christian. And the Christian replied, "Yes, but I have a great God." "He who abides in me," said Jesus, "and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit."

Installment 2: Maintenance & repairs
 At our last general assembly, several questions were asked about our maintenance & repairs budget, and rightfully so. It's not cheap to maintain a facility such as our church. The fixed contracts portion of our annual maintenance & repairs expenses includes:
 -Elevator maintenance: \$4,283.66 -Fire suppression: \$7,115.45
 -HVAC: \$16,449.00 -Janitorial: \$33,000.00
 -Lawn and Grounds: \$14,470.00 -Alarm System: \$1,275.19
 -Pest Control: \$1,063.23
 We also budget \$40,000 for general maintenance and repairs, and \$8,000 in maintenance & repair supplies.
 Please do your part in helping us maintain our beautiful church and contribute regularly and faithfully.

THE EPISTLE

(For the Twenty-fourth Sunday after Pentecost)

The Lord will give strength to His people.

Ascribe to the Lord, O sons of God, ascribe to the Lord honor and glory.
The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Ephesians. (2:14-22)

Brethren, Christ is our peace, Who has made us both one, and has broken down the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in His flesh the law of commandments and ordinances, that He might create in Himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the Cross, thereby bringing the hostility to an end. And He came and preached peace to you, who were far off, and peace to those who were near; for through Him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus Himself being the cornerstone, in Whom the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in Whom you also are built into it for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

THE GOSPEL

(For the Fourteenth Sunday of Luke)

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke. (18:35-43)

At that time, when Jesus drew near to Jericho, a blind man was sitting by the roadside begging; and hearing a multitude going by, he inquired what this meant. They told him, "Jesus of Nazareth is passing by." And he cried, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" And those who were in front rebuked him, telling him to be silent; but he cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" And Jesus stopped, and commanded him to be brought to him; and when he came near, Jesus asked him, "What do you want me to do for you?" He said, "Lord, let me receive my sight." And Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight; your faith has made you well." And immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus, glorifying God; and all the people, when they saw it, gave praise to God.

Commemorations

Orthodox Christians

Faithful Orthodox fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when they receive Holy Communion in fulfillment of Christ's command to eat His Body and drink His Blood. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, communicants should not be conscious of grave sin, have fasted from the night before taking communion, and seek to live in charity and love with their neighbors. Persons conscious of grave sin must first be reconciled with God and the Church through the Sacrament of Penance (Confession and Absolution). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

Non-Orthodox

We welcome to this celebration of the Eucharist those Christians who are not fully united with us. It is a consequence of the sad divisions in Christianity that we cannot extend to them a general invitation to receive Communion. Orthodox believe that the Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray.

Not Receiving Communion

Those not receiving sacramental communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another by receiving a piece of blessed bread following the dismissal prayers.

Welcome to Ss. Peter and Paul

To encourage our worship in a proper spirit of prayer and devotion, we respectfully ask you to enter the sanctuary quietly during the Divine Liturgy.

PLEASE DO NOT ENTER OR EXIT THE SANCTUARY AS

- the clergy censures the sanctuary
- the congregation is standing, or
- during the Little Entrance with the Gospel
- during the Reading of the Epistle and the Gospel
- Please enter the sanctuary upon the completion of
- the sermon
- the Great Entrance with the Holy Gifts
- the Prayers of Consecration p. 112-113
- the Hymn to the Theotokos "It is Truly Meet"

Please follow the directions of the ushers during Communion and dismissal; refrain from using cell phones in the narthex; and be considerate of those praying and converse in the hall, outside or downstairs.
