

PASTOR'S PEN: STAND FIRM AGAINST THE THEOLOGICAL FADS OF THE DAY



C. S. Lewis's words are timely as some church goers, even in the evangelical church, are drifting away from historical, biblical, Orthodox Christian faith, and falling prey to the current heresies of our day. Lewis writes,

"...there will be progress in Christian knowledge only as long as we accept the challenge of the difficult or repellent doctrines. A 'liberal' Christianity which considers itself free to alter the Faith whenever the Faith looks perplexing or repellent must be completely stagnant, Progress is made only into a resisting material...

Have I stood firm (super monstratas vias) amidst all these 'winds of doctrine?'... Our upbringing and the whole atmosphere of the world we live in make it certain that our main temptation will be that of yielding to winds of doctrine, not that of ignoring them. We are not at all likely to be hidebound: we are very likely to be the slaves of fashion. If one has to choose between reading the new books and reading the old, one must choose the old: not because they are necessarily better but because they contain precisely those truths of which our own age is neglectful. The standard of permanent Christianity must be kept clear in our minds and it is against that standard that we must test all contemporary thought. In fact, we must at all costs not move with the times. We serve One who said, 'Heaven and Earth shall move with the times, but my words shall not move with the times'...

Our business is to present that which is timeless (the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow) in the particular language of our own age. The bad preacher does exactly the opposite... The core of his thought is merely contemporary; only the superficies is traditional. But your teaching must be timeless at its heart and wear a modern dress." cont'd on page 2



BOOK REVIEW: SAINT GEORGE AND THE DRAGON BY JIM FOREST

(The author visited s. Peter and Paul on October 20th and offered the homily... the book is now available at the Ss. Peter and Paul bookstore for \$20. It would be an outstanding gift for baptisms and god children).

The book is published by St. Vladimir's Seminary Press and was awarded the 2012 Gold Medal Moonbeam Spirit Award. The book is illustrated in iconographic style by Vladislav Andrejev. The Moonbeam Spirit Award is given "for dedication to children's books and literacy and for inspired writing, illustrating and publishing," according to Jenkins Group, Inc., which bestows the awards. Theodor Bazol, senior advisor at St. Vladimir's Seminary Press, said, "The 'wedding' of words by Jim Forest, incredible images by Vladislav Andrejev, and beautiful design represents an effort to communicate Judeo-Christian moral and ethical teaching to children and youth". The book ends with historical notes and examples of St. George icons. As an


EXPLORING OUR FAITH: ADULT RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FORM
